## **EVCNB Individual PreSA Form Filling Instructions**

**Time**: Use 24-hour time. For instance: 8 am=0800, 11 am=1100, noon =1200, 1 pm=1300, 8 pm = 2000, midnight=0000.

**Zone/Cluster**: Note the Yellow Radio Zone the assessed area is in. If additionally in a PYN cluster, note both zone and cluster.

Street: Note the streets assessed; include start and end points (e.g., "Pine from 4th to 5th"). EACH STREET GETS A SEPARATE FORM.

For the following, if in doubt between two categories, count in the more severe category.

- **1.1: Injuries Minor**. Person is conscious, alert and breathing normally. He/she is injured but can walk. Do not count uninjured persons in this category.
- **1.2: Injuries Moderate**. Person is conscious, alert, and breathing normally. He/she has evidence of bleeding that is controlled or he/she cannot walk due to other injuries.
- **1.3: Injuries Severe**. Person is not conscious or if conscious is confused or disoriented. He/she may be breathing rapidly. If bleeding, the bleeding is heavy and not controlled.
- **1.4: Persons Trapped**. Use this category for persons you see or hear in a building that are not able to get out. Note their injuries in 1.1-1.3 if known. DO NOT ENTER BUILDING TO MAKE ASSESSMENT.
- 1.5: Injuries Presumed Dead. Person is not conscious, not responsive at all, not breathing.
- 2.1: Fire. Count all live fires seen. Note if fire involves structures (how many) or just trees/brush. Do not include extinguished fires.
- **3.1: Access**. Note all roads that are blocked by trees, cars, structures, wires, or other obstructions. Include buckled or flooded roads.
- **4.1: Buildings Surveyed**. Count number of units observed. A unit is one house, one condo building, one apartment building, one hotel/motel. A unit is considered to be on the street its house numbers are on (or front door if no house numbers). DO NOT WALK AROUND OR ENTER ANY BUILDING survey from street only. Record house numbers in sections 4.2-4.4 if there is damage.
- **4.2: Building Light Damage**. Damage to unit limited to broken windows or siding off/missing or porch damage. No structural damage or roof damage to unit. Do not count undamaged units here. Include them as part of your count in 4.1.
- **4.3: Building Moderate Damage**. Some structural damage seen: roof and/or walls tilted or out of alignment.
- **4.4: Building Heavy Damage**. Severe structural damage seen: partial or full collapse of unit, unit off foundation, or roof partially or fully off.
- **5.1: Hazards Gas/propane Leaks**. Note visual evidence of broken/disconnected propane lines, or smell of propane, with approximate location. Propane has a strong, unpleasant odor like rotten eggs, a skunk's spray, or a dead animal.
- **5.2: Hazards Sewer Leaks.** Note visual evidence of broken/disconnected sewer lines, or smell of sewage, with approximate location.
- **5.3: Hazards Water Main Leaks**. Note visual evidence of broken/disconnected water lines discharging water, with approximate location. Record additionally in 3.1 if broken water main has flooded road.
- **5.4:** Hazards Electrical Power. Note any power lines down from any unit; record additionally in 3.1 if downed lines are blocking road access. Note number of units observed that appear to be without electrical power to unit.
